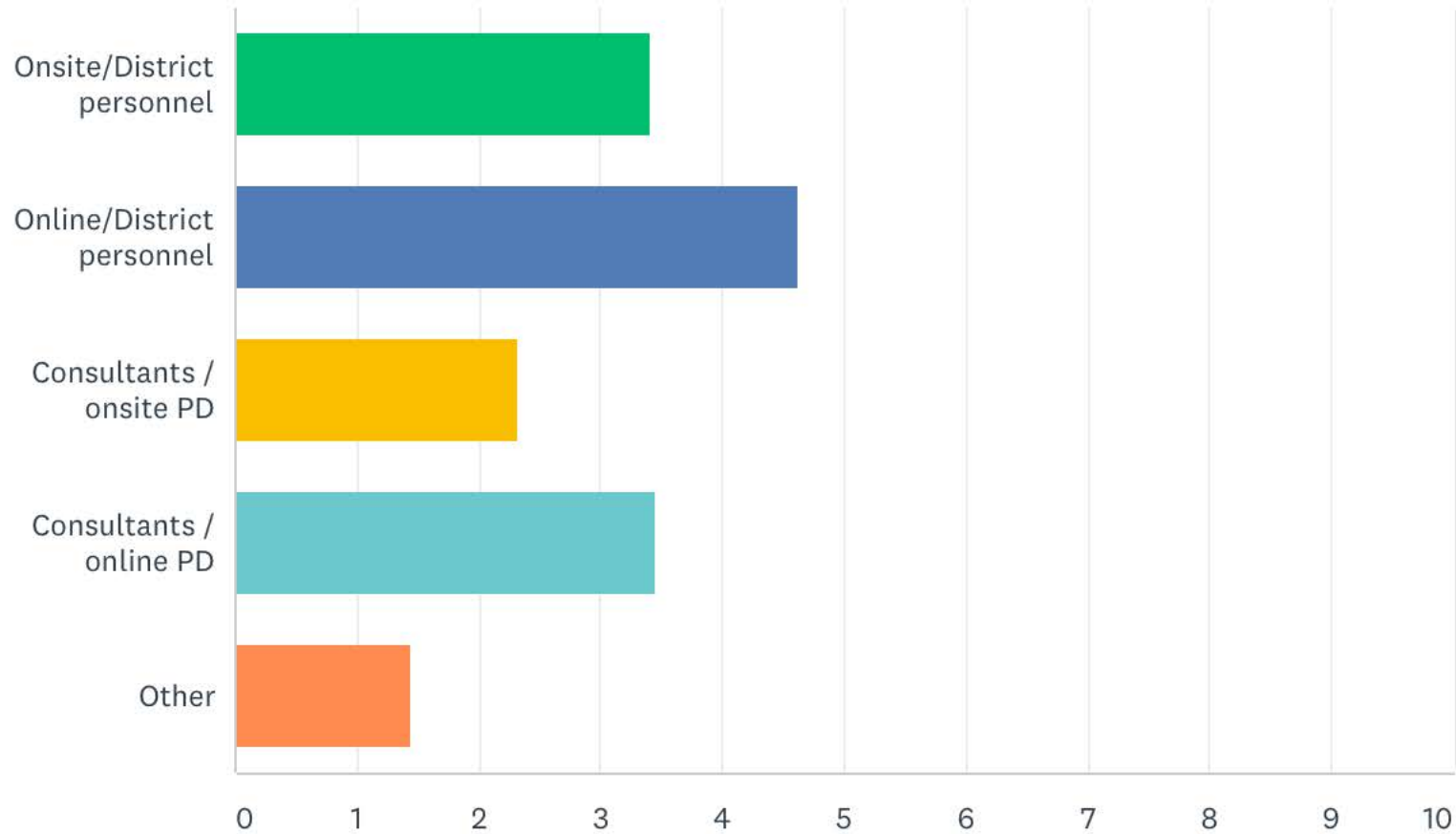


What are a few ways

your district?



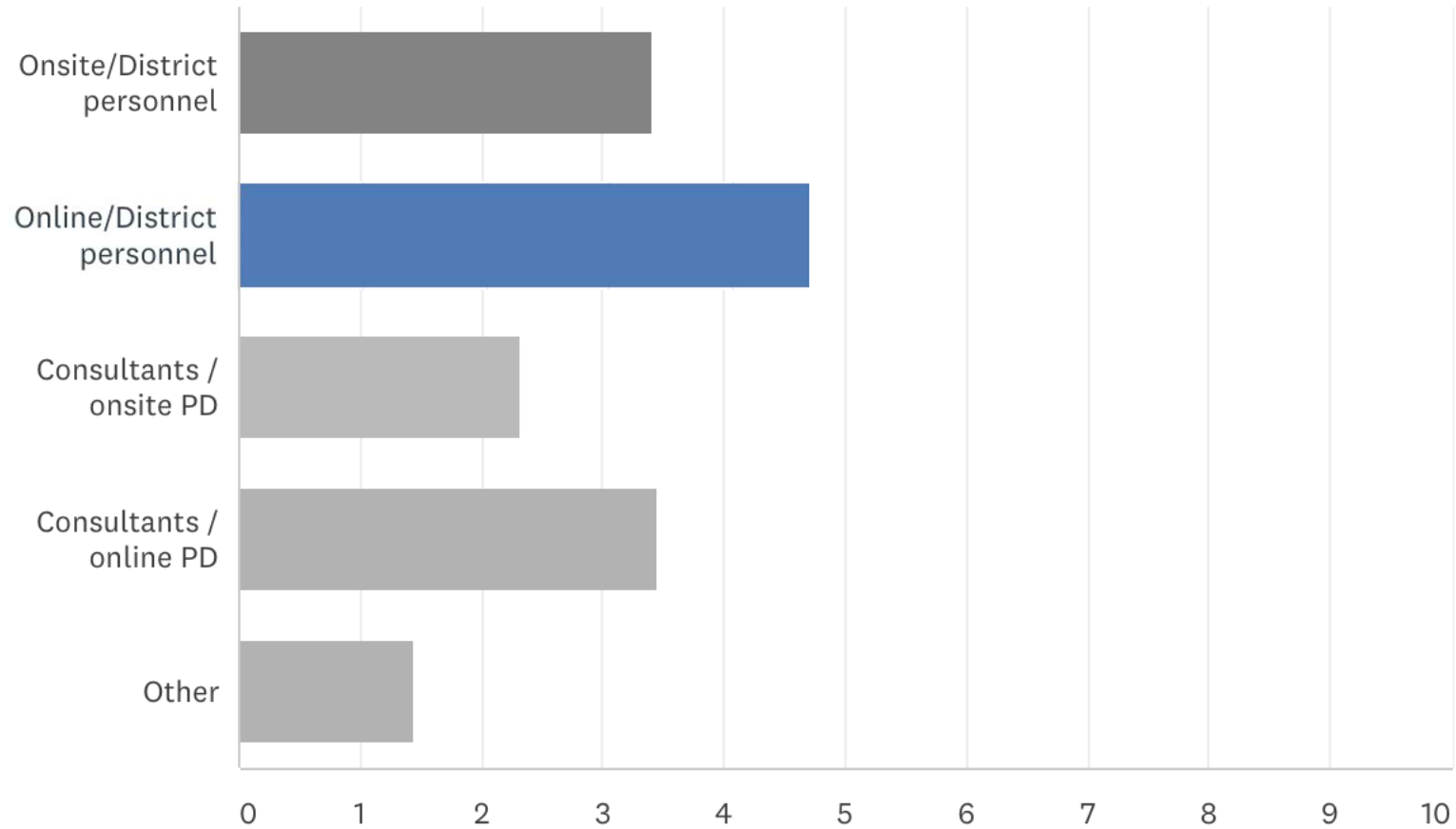

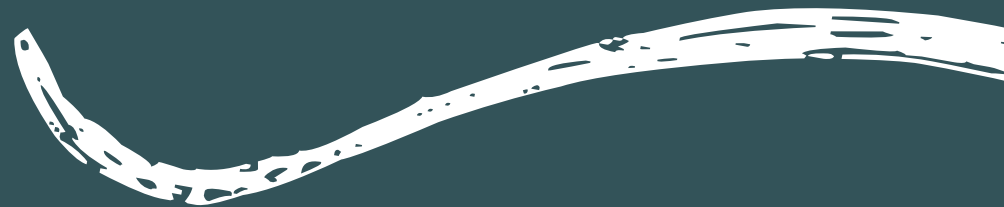
